

You may use ICT to research and to print homework. **However, writing/printing must be entirely in your own words and good presentation is an essential expectation of your work.** In Maths, Science or Design tasks, you may prefer to use squared paper.

<p>Literacy and Communication</p>	<p>Find out what a memoir is (as opposed to a diary). Queen Elizabeth II has been the monarch of our country for longer than any other monarch in our history. Research the Queen’s life and then, write a memoir of no more than 3 real events from her life. Write in the 1st person (<i>I or One</i>, not <i>She</i>). Try to include real information such as the accurate names and dates of places/people. <i>Between 3 and 5 sides long A4</i></p>	<p>Write a new ending for a well-known story. Choose a traditional fairy tale (such as Cinderella, Beauty and the Beast or Goldilocks). Write it in your own words, giving it a new ending. <i>Remember that VCOP and MORERAPS may help you to write a more creative piece of work. Between 3 and 5 sides long A4</i></p>	<p>Free writing Write about something of your own choice. Remember to use all your skills of handwriting and Purple Pen checking to make it the best that it can be. Ask an adult to help you <i>by reading it aloud</i> so that you can listen to it and make the necessary corrections or improvements. Check the Wordlists for ambitious words. <i>Between 3 and 5 sides long A4</i></p>
<p>Maths and Problem Solving (Maths thinking skills, logic)</p>	<p>Ask an adult to test you on your 13, 14 or 15 X Tables. Write the questions 1x13... to 12 x 13 on pieces of paper, with the answers on the back. Mix them up and then choose one to answer. Turn them over to check your answers until you know each one of them with no mistakes. Ask an adult to play this with you and see who wins. Do the same with 14’s and 15’s.</p>	<p>Using the method already explained, ask an adult to test your knowledge of SQUARE or TRIANGULAR numbers by writing them on pieces of paper and testing yourself.</p> <p>BIDMAS write some multi-step problem sentences and use BIDMAS to solve them and test yourself e.g. $(12 \times 3) + 4 = \dots$ $12 \times (3 + 4) = \dots$</p>	<p>SHAPE make nets of 3-d shapes; cube, cuboid, pyramids (square/triangular based) and maybe challenge yourself to make a hexagonal 3-d shape. Remember to add tabs for sticking down the edges. Create a Table to show the faces, edges and vertices of each shape.</p>
<p>Science and the Outside Environment (Science, Eco, PE, healthy lifestyles etc)</p>	<p>Create a poster about one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> explain to a teenager why a good routine, a varied diet and both exercise <i>and</i> sleep are so important to their health label a drawing to explain what the circulatory system is label a drawing to show the place and function of these organs; heart, lungs, liver, stomach, kidneys 	<p>Find out what the following people do, then apply for a job as a trainee in that specialism, using your own skills to say why you would be well-suited to that work</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Palaeontologist Epidemiologist Lepidopterist Entomologist <p>Spellings and real-life skills are important when applying for work. You will need to use formal language in your letter.</p>	<p>Research Task Find out more about a useful technological invention of your choice (a real one – not imaginary). Use lots of relevant information and key words. Add a glossary, so that each technical word has a clear definition. Remember to use capital letters for proper nouns. Present it in any way of your choice.</p>
<p>Humanities and Citizenship (RE, History, Geography, Moral, Social and Economic awareness)</p>	<p>Find out about life in the 1920’s in another part of the world. For instance, what was happening in Africa, Asia or America in the 1920’s? Who was famous? What was invented? What new laws or rights were introduced, and why? Present your findings in a style of your choice.</p>	<p>Find out more about the United Nations ‘Convention on the Rights of the Child’. What is the document about? Why, when and by whom was it written? What is your opinion about the rights? Choose your top 5 to copy in your very best handwriting and then illustrate, using watercolours or coloured pencils.</p>	<p>Write a news article about something that interests you. Use your knowledge of the <i>news report genre</i> to help you in choosing good vocabulary and attention-grabbing headlines. Divide your page into columns if this helps.</p>
<p>Creative Arts (Art, Design and Technology, Music, Drama and Dance)</p>	<p>Write a Playscript. The story has to include 2 characters; A and B. One character should have a secret from the other. It is up to you to decide if the secret should be told or not... All other elements, such as setting or time, are entirely up to you. <i>Between 3 and 5 sides long A4</i></p>	<p>Leaflet. Create a leaflet encouraging people to visit the theatre and see live performances instead of films. You may use your own experiences and persuasive devices (discounts, vouchers, persuasive language) to tempt your readers to go to back to the theatres, once they have re-opened.</p>	<p>Create a song to cheer people up. You may write an original tune, or you can use an existing tune and give it new lyrics. Record your song for others to hear.</p>
<p>Working Together</p>	<p>Hangman. Challenge someone from your family to a game of tricky words hangman. Look-up interesting new words from the dictionary, thesaurus or internet. If you spell something incorrectly...you lose! Keep a note of any new words you learn. If you find the words too easy, try changing the root word for extra challenge, for instance; <i>probable to improbable.</i></p>	<p>Learn to play whist This card game requires memory and numeracy skills. It can also help you learn to play Bridge if you are feeling ready for a greater challenge.</p>	<p>Learn how to make an omelette or cheese on toast</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask an adult to supervise Remember to wash your hands before any food preparation Clean up the kitchen afterwards
